"Downtown Memphis is a thriving, growing neighborhood and a gem," said Memphis City School Superintendent James B. Wilson. "We are excited about the return of a public school to this community. It will be a state-of-the-art facility that will serve a diverse group of young citizens and their families - just as Memphis does. We will continue to be a school in which all Memphians can take great pride."

The 1914 student population will start with 135 students from the Canine elementary area, but will also include 100 to 150 other students who will register and enroll, that will be based on the time of open enrollment. Although corporate partnerships in education are encouraged and welcome, downtown businesses will not have a priority in the enrollment process. Instead, all opportunities will be implemented in future years. PHSU students will receive admission priority, but DeSoto County students may apply for transfer to the school with said tuition.

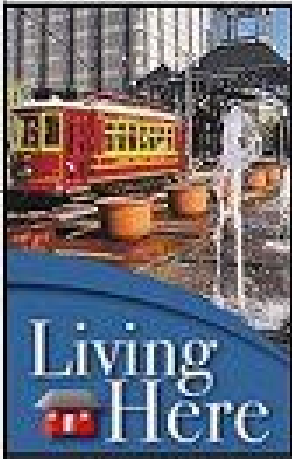
Once registered, students may attend the downtown school from kindergarten through the sixth grade. Student/teacher ratios in the school's classrooms, which are mandated for all schools by the State Department of Education, will be 20:1 kindergarten through third grade students per teacher, and 25:1 fourth through sixth grade students per teacher.

The downtown school's principal will be selected this spring from submitted applications that will be reviewed by a committee comprised of parents and school officials. In turn, the principal will hire the teachers and staff for the downtown school.

Opportunities for parents to get involved in the decision-making process for the downtown school will be available through future MOED meetings announced through the Commercial Appeal and other media sources. In addition to having input on the selection of the school's principal, other issues that parents can discuss include the possibility of:

- Extended hours for after-school daycare.
- Summer break timing.
- Year-round scheduling.
- Curriculum model options in art, technology, foreign language, or other enrichment areas.

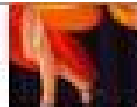

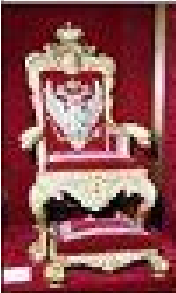
