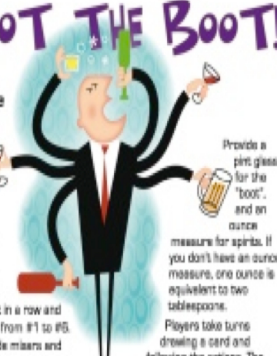
New Year's Left-Right Game
