


Punctuation



AMPERSAND

Used to connect two words or phrases.



ASTERISK

Used to denote a footnote or a reference to a specific page.



BRACES

Used to group related items or to indicate a range of numbers.




DAGGER

Used to denote a footnote or a reference to a specific page.



ELLIPSIS

Used to indicate a pause or a break in a sentence.



INFINITY

Used to denote an endless quantity.



INTERROGANG

Used to denote a question or a statement that is being questioned.



PARENTHESES

Used to enclose a word or phrase that is not essential to the meaning of a sentence.



PECROW

Used to denote a specific point or direction.



QUESTION MARK

Used to denote a question or a statement that is being questioned.



SECTION SIGN

Used to denote a specific section or chapter.



SEMICOLON

Used to separate two related clauses or to indicate a list of items.

 The writer who signs, punctuates, or organizes, is called a **stylist** or **editor**.
