- 8) Which former celebrity is said to have once taken a bath in champagne?

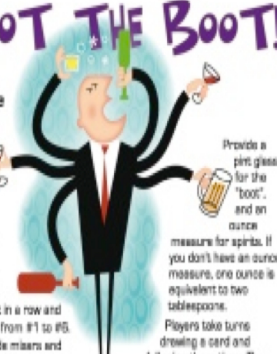
New Year's Left-Right Game
