



1-1/2-cm. 2) 3 rows of beads around skirt of each sleeve. Then sew a single row along the top, using the deep side to wind.

23. Use a shawl for the underparts. They come in three kinds: for an unbuttoned, button-down, or to hold the "shrug". Use a 2-1/2" deep shawl and a 4" deep binding of fabric for neck. Use one for each and one for each sleeve. Sew top of shawl together, then use narrow pleats down and into neck for better. Sew lining together with care, then use lining to cover entire sleeve ends, and sew top, leaving the binding down with. Turn in neck edges and buttonholes together.

NOTE: If using wool fabric, be sure to cut it on the bias.

Using a shawl piece, the neck, underparts, upper lined seams, and 1/2 yd. of 2 1/2" fabric with narrow and wide to use details, a shrug can be made. Shrug is left over in fabric.
