

More Stem-changing Verbs

The following verbs all have an **o** that changes to **ue** in all but the nosotros and vosotros forms.

Example:	<u>dormir</u> — to sleep
	duermo dormimos
	duerme dormis
	duerme duermen



almorzar	to eat lunch	aprobar	to approve
colgar	to hang (up)	comover	to move (emotionally)
contar	to count	costar*	to cost
demonstrar	to show, demonstrate	devolver	to return, give back
doler	to hurt, ache	dormir	to sleep
encontrar	to find (think: encounter)	envolver	to wrap (up) (think: envelop)
llover*	to rain	morder	to bite
mostrar	to show	poder	to be able, can
probar	to prove, test, sample, taste	recordar	to remember
resolver	to solve	rogar	to beg, to pray
soler	to be accustomed to	soñar (con)	to dream (about)
tostar	to toast	tronar*	to thunder
volver	to return	volar	to fly

* verbs with limited conjugations (can you ever say "we rain"?)

The verbs below have an **e** that changes to an **i** in all but the nosotros and vosotros forms.

**Notice that all these verbs end in -ir, and that some of them are from your -go verbs list!

Example:	<u>pedir</u> — to request, to ask for
	PIDO pedimos
	pides pedis
	pide piden

conseguir	to obtain, to get	corregir	to correct
decir	to say, to tell	despedir	to fire
elegir	to elect	freír	to fry
gemir	to groan, to moan	impedir	to impede, to hinder
maldecir	to curse	medir	to be long, to measure
pedir	to request, to ask for	reír	to laugh
refiñir	to quarrel, to scold	repetir	to repeat
seguir	to follow, to continue	servir	to serve
sonreír	to smile	vestir	to dress
