

# Compound Sentences

A compound sentence contains two simple sentences joined by a conjunction. The two sentences are on different lines, and each has its own punctuation.

There was no fish dinner, but Mary still ate.  
She doesn't like cooking anyway, does she?  
Mary said there is "no simple answer."  
Just something else.  
Lucky this isn't an idea from the experts.  
Lucky you don't eat simple answers!  
After all, the best simple answers are  
the ones that make sense.

Remember?  
Put a comma to separate  
the two clauses, just like  
two simple sentences.

When writing a compound sentence,  
make sure each clause  
has its own subject and verb.  
This makes the sentence clear  
and easy to understand.
