As you read the sentences slowly to your child, run your finger under the words. Stop under each picture and have your little learner "read" it aloud. Reading pictures is an excellent preparation for reading words. Have fun with this activity!

Bath time is a wonderful opportunity to reinforce numbers and recognition of parts of the body. Give your child a washcloth and ask her to wash a certain part of her body. For example: "Wash your two hands." Help her if she is not sure. When your child is ready, name another part of the body. When your little one finds it easy to identify one part of the body, say two parts at a time. For example: "Wash your ankle and toes." This game also develops eye-hand coordination.
