



Spider

Spiders produce silk, a thin, strong protein strand, which they use to build webs for trapping insects. Spiders are found worldwide, except in the oceans, and they live in all habitats and at most elevations.



Butterfly

The butterfly is an insect with four wings which transfer the pollen from one flower to another to allow the plants to reproduce. It starts its life as a caterpillar, then goes through metamorphosis to become a butterfly.



Bee

Bees are the most important pollinating insects, and some create honey from the pollen they collect. Honey has many medicinal uses, and is the only food that contains all the substances necessary to sustain human life.

Dragonflies are the world's fastest insects, flying at speeds of 19-38 miles per hour. They are primarily found near water, since they lay their eggs in or near water, and they eat mosquitoes and other harmful insects.
