## QUILT LABELS GREAT FOR CIFTS!



If you want to buy your labels ready to go, we recommend the retro style of Baby Jane quilt label yardage by Cosmo Cricket. The panel gives you so many shapes and sizes to choose from in sweet vintage graphics and go-with-anything shades. ## YOU WILL NEED

- Quilt labels (shop bought see above – or downloaded FREE from our blog)
- Fusible interfacing
- Permanent fabric marker (fine-tipped is preferable)

## **CUTTING OUT**

- 1 Cut out your chosen quilt label leaving a 5mm seam allowance.
- Measure the size of your quilt label and then cut out a piece of fusible interfacing that's 5mm smaller than the quilt label on all four sides (Step a).
- If you want to write on your label, use a permanent, washable fabric marker, add any information you'd like to include.
- 4 Press the interfacing in place on the wrong side of the quilt label. Position it in the middle of the label with 5mm of the label bordering all four sides (Step b).
- Fold the raw fabric edges over to the back of the label (use the interfacing as a guide) and press well with a dry iron.
- Use matching thread to whipstitch your quilt label in place on your quilt, by hand to finish (Step c).
