They ran away all making wet—

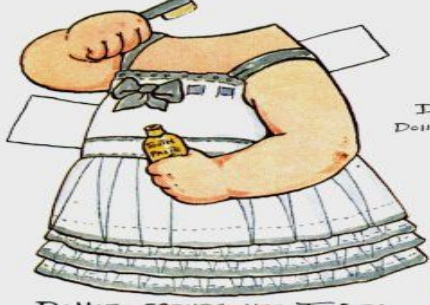
I think they might be running

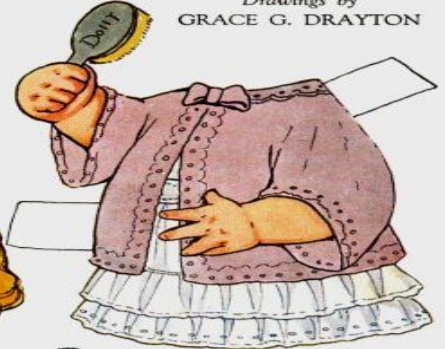

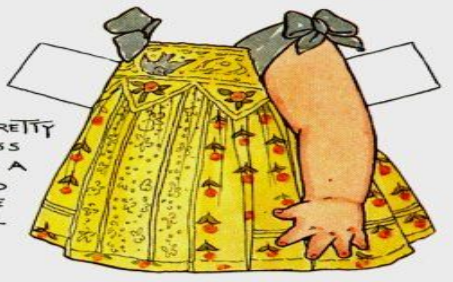
