First-Aid Safety Procedures

When providing first aid for bleeding or other potential injuries to coworkers, patients, follow these rules:

1. **Wear rubber gloves.** To help you prevent and cut your work off and protect the clothing gloves.
2. **Wear safety goggles.** When a person is receiving a serious injury.
3. **Wash a wound properly.** Clean a person's wounds using a lot of clean water.
4. **If your site is not certified, use certified medical training.**
5. **In the event you become exposed to a hazardous material, call the fire department, and have the material or substance taken to a certified, nearby hospital if possible. If possible, no a patient.**
6. **Reported water must be properly tagged, sealed and removed to a certified medical facility immediately.**
