Holiday Left Right Game

How to play:

Objective: Pass a gift (or ornament) wrapped to the left or right around the circle as the story is read. Lots of fun!

Players: 2 or more players (perfect for a very large group too)

Needed: Each participant should have an ornament or gift that has been wrapped.

Rules: Sit or stand, what ever way is easiest, in a circle. Each person should be holding one gift. One person reads the story (below). When you hear "right" pass a gift to the person on the right. When you hear "left" pass the gift you're holding to the person on your left. At the end whatever gift you're left with is yours.
