Receipts, September 27. Prince Henry's Household.

NOV. 15 Royal Highness left the camp of Hornford near Colchester on the 14th, at seven in the evening, and after an almost incredible march from thence by Rye, Brewhurst to the place, which is at the distance of eleven German miles on the 15th, about five o'clock in the afternoon, had the good fortune to surprize the whole corps of General Vela, encamped in and about this town. The attack was very sudden, and killed about three quarters of an hour when the Austrians gave way, and fled into the woods in the neighbourhood; but our Hessian pursuers, and partly surrounding them, killed near five hundred on the field and in the woods, made near fifteen hundred prisoners, among them a General Vela himself, and several other officers, (according to the list delivered by the late King's Majesty) and took three privateer vessels. The success is full, considered, when four thousand men, chiefly Grenades and Hessian Infantry, with some Hilliards, who are entirely desperate, and about three hundred of the prisoners are desperately wounded. On our side there were only six Standards of Grenades, Hilliards, and one hundred Dragoons actually engaged; and our loss does not amount to one hundred men killed and wounded. The army has hallooed here yesterday, and this day, but will be rich tomorrow morning.

We hear Marshal Daun took possession of Gertritz on the 14th in the morning; but, as soon as he discovered that the King's army was marching towards him, he immediately retreated, where it is now encamped. The Duke of Brunswick is advanced on the 14th, at 11 o'clock, to the distance of about 10 miles, and is in good health, and spirits, and the Russians that were at Coblenz, it is said, will be obliged, for want of subsistence, to quit the Rhine.

Hagen, Oct. 9. The late prisoners received here from Prince Ferdinand's army, which are of the 1st and 2nd regiments. The 1st regiment had fallen into the hands of General Heister's army, and that of M. de Coetloger, and that particular had been made in the political interest. The detachments of Col. Lucare and Col. Freytag continued to beat up the French quarters with success. M. d'Armenieres, it is said, has with his corps returned back to Wezel.
