	<b>6/12 months in advance of your Wedding Day</b>					
<b>Step 1:</b>	First thing to do is to decide what time of the year you wish to get married and pick the wedding date. Bear in mind getting married in the summer time can be more expensive, especially when organising venues etc. I would suggest spring, early autumn or Christmas time are great times for a wedding and would certainly cut the cost considerably. If you can - do go for a week day as this can cut as much as 20/30% from the overall cost of the venue. Set a budget					
<b>Step 2:</b>	Once you have set the date be sure to <b>book the chapel, church, registry office</b> , or wherever you decide to have the wedding ceremony. As soon as your date is known now is the time to contact the Priest, Minister or Registrar. Again remember a chapel/church wedding needs to be booked three months in advance. Second thing to be considered is where are you going to get married					
<b>Step 3:</b>	your dream location. Take your time on this one especially in this climate as most businesses are crying out for weddings so therefore that puts you in the driving seat so shop around and see who can give you the best deals. Don't be driven by cost remember it is your wedding day and the venue is something that you want everyone in attendance to enjoy and talk about for months afterwards.
