



WINDOW STEP

7th House on the Left



CUT ME

(WHAT YOU NEED)
a clean surface
craft paper
scissors

(THINGS TO REMEMBER)

1. When placing the stencil onto the contact paper, make sure the paper side, not contact, faces out.
2. Keep the stencil taut. This will give you a much clearer cut.
3. Check the entire stencil and paper you cut. After you finish applying your line, lift up the stencil piece you cut on the window with a key. Check under the contact paper backing. If it's all there, you've cut the window. If not, you'll have to re-cut.
4. When you're done, you can use the stencil to cut out more pieces of contact paper to use as a stencil for other windows.
