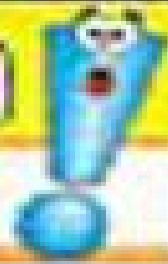


Punctuation!



•	period	<p>Use a period to the end of a sentence. <i>Example: I love my cat.</i></p>
?	question mark	<p>Use a question mark at the end of a sentence to indicate that it's a question. <i>Example: How old are you?</i></p>
!	exclamation mark	<p>Use an exclamation mark after a sentence to indicate strong feeling. <i>Example: What a surprise!</i></p>
" "	quotation marks	<p>Use opening and closing quotation marks to indicate the words of another person. <i>Example: "I love my cat."</i></p>
()	parentheses	<p>Use parentheses to indicate extra information. <i>Example: (My cat is named Spot.) I love my cat.</i></p>
:	colon	<p>Use a colon to separate two related parts of a sentence. <i>Example: I have two cats: Spot and Mittens.</i></p>
'	apostrophe	<p>Use an apostrophe to show ownership or to form a contraction. <i>Example: John's book. It won't rain today.</i></p>
,	comma	<p>Use a comma to separate items in a list. <i>Example: Apples, oranges, and bananas.</i></p> <p>Use a comma to separate a clause from the rest of a sentence. <i>Example: After the meeting, we went to the store.</i></p> <p>Use a comma after the greeting and closing of a letter. <i>Example: Dear Mom, ... Love, Emily.</i></p>
